### From the Principal

01 May 2009

Dear Parents and Friends

It is always encouraging for our students and staff to see students doing well in their activities, so we are proud to congratulate various groups of students this week.

Both our school's two Year 7-8 Debating Teams won their Competitions in the Warrnambool Eisteddfod this week – Congratulations to Farzana Khanyari, Courtney Hoy, and Madeline Winzar in Team A, and to Renee Arms, Elspeth Bawden, and Jacob Snook of Team B.

The Year 9-10 Debating team of Ally Dickinson, Lexia Politis and Lil Williams also competed very creditably today. Two Year 11 & 12 teams compete on Monday.

Congratulations to Sarah Hall who represented King's College at the Primary Zone Athletics last Thursday. She put in some wonderful jumps to finish 5<sup>th</sup> in the triple jump event and contended with difficult weather conditions to finish 7<sup>th</sup> in the 1500m. Well done Sarah! We were very proud to have her represent our school.

On Tuesday this week three school teams competed in the State Christian Schools Netball Competitions at Bendigo. The Year 9-10 boys get our high praise for winning the competition – congratulations. Of our two VCE teams, Team A won the preliminary final and finished overall runners up.

On another matter, in Primary we have been delighted with the commencement of the PLANN programme in Grades 5 & 6 (Pilot Literacy and Numeracy Networks). This is a research programme designed to build students' and staff skills in using IT to enhance comprehension in the classroom. This is a part of the Commonwealth Government's Literacy and Numeracy building programmes. Our school is fortunate to be invited to take part. The research is based on student performances over a long period, and the results will be used to develop on-going curriculum delivery projects for all schools. The programme is administered by the Association of Independent Schools, of which we are members.

Initial surveys of our students showed very pleasing strengths in many comprehension areas. This is consistent with the other standardised tests results in the AIM and NAPLAN results over many years. Students are responding with enthusiasm to the activities.

The Commonwealth has announced that King's College is to receive \$150,000 from the Rudd Government "*Pride in our Schools*" programme. The funds are for maintenance, and will be used in a variety of areas of the school. The playground and traffic areas will be partly resealed, with improvements to paths. Painting will be done around the school both inside and out. The Primary wing will get special painting priority as it is now fairly well worn in some places. Likewise, new vinyl will be laid through much of the administration and primary areas. This work will begin in a very short time and will be completed this year.

Applications have been made for funds under the programme for a library and multipurpose area. The government will likely make announcements about this aspect of funding quite soon. It is exciting to have all these programmes coming on stream to benefit our students. In quite a different government funding programme, we are currently letting contracts to refurbish the Home Economics room, and install a mezzanine area in the Sports Centre. The Home Eco room will likely be done over July.
