## From the Principal

Dear Parents and Friends

### IMPORTANT ---TRAFFIC CONTROL!!

Welcome back to Term Four. You will see building projects progressing in various parts of the campus this term. The Library building site was levelled over the holidays, as we wanted no heavy machinery around with children present. The site access for builders will be from the top car park – this is the only possible place for vehicle access to the site. The site is fenced off, and children know which ways they need to walk to get around the school. A new path has been constructed into the junior block from the end of the top car park.

With these changes, several car park spots are now not available for parents. These are at the north end of the park, where the builders' access is. Because of safety and traffic management issues, a teacher will be on duty at this area before and after school every day. We have asked several staff members to use the main park from now on to make more space available for Prep – Grade 2

parents in the top park.

Parents are reminded that only Grades Prep to Grade 2 children are to be dropped off or collected through the top car park. All other families please use the main car park. We remind all families that no parking is allowed in Eliza Court. No children are permitted to leave the school and be picked up out on the roads, as the School cannot supervise this, and we cannot be responsible for the safety of children other than those who walk to school and use the school crossing.

Your special cooperation and patience are needed in the car parks during this time of construction and progress. Please observe the S\_L\_O\_W Limit, and be especially careful when backing. Thank you.

We are keeping a close eye on the traffic and safety management, and if further changes are needed we will let you know.

Good progress is being made by our builders, and the sports centre work is nearly complete, as are the changes to the secondary toilet block!

## Prep – Grade 3 Swimming Program

On Monday, October 26th, 2009, students in Prep, Grade 1, Grade 2 and Grade 3 will commence swimming lessons at Aquazone. Students will participate in 8 lessons over a two week period.
